


### ONE BOOK WHONNOCK



### THORNHILL COMMUNITY ASSOCIATION

The Thornhill Hall bookings have been picking up since the Province lifted some of the restrictions regarding COVID 19, that made various events cumbersome and in some cases were not possible until now. The limit to the number of people who can attend an event at the Hall is only dependent on the Hall's fire regulated capacity which is 100.

In the past two years, our larger community was asked to provide input into some upgrades to the playground facilities and changes to the Frisbee Golf Course. Changes were also made to the perimeter fencing and updating signage.

Parks and Recreation included the community through on-site meetings and surveys both online and through the mail.

New fencing replaces the dated chain link and the new playground is designed to blend into the natural environment.

Changes to the Frisbee Golf Course were to eliminate dangerous throw areas and will become more respectful to the broad community users of the park such as walkers and equestrian traffic.

We appreciate how Parks made a genuine effort to listen and apply the requested changes that reflect the Neighbourhood wishes.

### TAPS THORNHILL AQUIFER PROTECTION STUDY (SINCE 2016)

The spring never felt more wet and cold in my memory. So on one hand we felt grateful that our wells were full and the worry about water loss had diminished until the hot, dry summer came upon us from July onward. Many farmers suffered on both ends with late crops, insects, flooding, drought, increasing prices for fertilizer, fuel, shortage of labour, food costs and loss of revenue. On rural lands where it is possible to grow some of our own food it is important that we have a continual supply of clean water.

Climate change is upon us.

Our deep well measurements have remained consistent and that has been a relief to the well owners. Our next measurement is in December. The tree canopy in the watershed is paramount to maintaining our water levels. The City's goal to develop the Watershed into Light Industrial continues to be troublesome and we are making every effort to change their plans through education and our vote.

We wish you all good health as we enter the fall and winter months. We recommend that you continue to closely monitor your well and keep consistent records.

### RIDGE CANOE KAYAK CLUB



The Ridge Canoe and Kayak Club had another busy and successful season! It started with our high performance athletes having the opportunity to attend a three-week spring training camp in Portugal in April. It was definitely a highlight and an amazing experience for these athletes.

Our Junior and Senior high performance athletes, had a very successful competitive season, both locally and nationally. In May, RCKC hosted our Season Opening Regatta at Whonnock, bringing together over 100 paddlers from around the province, to kick off our competitive season.

Also in May, one of our senior athletes competed in the first National Team Trials held in Halifax, and three athletes competed in June, in the second National Team Trials, in Montreal. Cassidy MacPherson performed well, making A Finals in all her races. Brian Malfesi won the K1 1000m to earn a spot on the Senior European World Cup Tour and the World Championships Team.

In July, several of our Junior Athletes represented our region in the BC Summer Games, held in Prince George. We are very proud of Tyler Billing, Tyler Geisler, Ethan Hennig, Adia Irvine-Roberts and Xander Mouland for their performances and the sportsmanship they dis-played.

In August, three of our senior athletes, Cassidy MacPherson, Bryant Kelleway and Landon Drain traveled to Welland, Ontario with Team BC, to compete in the Canada Summer Games. Cassidy came away with a K2 Bronze medal and two K1 Silver medals. Bryant and Landon placed 4th in the K4 and made multiple A finals.

Nine of our athletes qualified for the Canadian National Championships, which took place in August at Shawinigan Lake in Quebec. Abigail Donaldson, Cassidy, Brian and Bryant all won medals and all of our nine of our athletes made A Finals!

Our competitive season ended in early September where we co-hosted the Fort - Ridge Fall Classic Regatta with the Fort Canoe Kayak Club at Whonnock Lake. This was the largest regatta in recent memory in BC, hosting over 200 athletes from BC, Saskatchewan, Yukon and Washington State.

RCKC also offers many recreational programs for our community. This year, we were able to run a full slate of one-day school camps for about 1000 students from Maple Ridge, Mission, Pitt Meadows and Coquitlam. We also were able to offer our normal week-long summer programs in conjunction with the Maple Ridge Recreation Department and hosted camps for both Scouts and Girl Guides.

The Junior Development, High Performance and Masters programs are all being offered for the Fall and Winter season. Registration is now open! Please contact our head coach headcoach@rckc.ca for information on how to register.


